### **NEW BYLAWS:**

Bylaw No. 72-2024 Zoning By-law reflecting revisions to Bylaw No. 22-2013 Zoning By-law are now in effect. # **Qualifications/Requirements are:**

- Full time days for the 2 weeks of July 8-19<sup>th</sup> (excluding weekends) Start and end
  - times of each session will be determined once registrations are complete. This timeline for lessons <u>may be</u> negotiable.
- Instructor must prepare a daily lesson plan; evaluate progress; teach lessons in the lake; and be able to communicate effectively with parents.



- Transportation will be the responsibility of the Instructor.
- Salary is to be paid at competitive hourly rates and may include an allowance for fuel, depending on traveling expectations.

SPORTS & RECREATION PROJECT: Glen Harbour's Sports and Recreation Team has received approval from the Village Council to proceed with a multi-purpose sports court that will include a fenced pickleball court, basketball pad with hoop, green space and irrigation. The estimated cost of the project is over \$100,000.00. The Sports and Recreation fund currently has approximately \$60,000.00. To complete the project we are asking you, as a Glen Harbour resident and/or business owner to provide either a personal or corporate donation. We have applied for some Grant funds but cannot count on that as a definite source of funding. ### **FIRE SAFETY TIPS:**

- 1. Install smoke alarms, check regularly to ensure they are working
- 2. Have a working fire extinguisher in a readily available place
- 3. Install asphalt/ slate or other non-flammable shingles
- 4. Store cut wood a safe distance from your house
- 5. Have an easily assessable water hose available
- 6. Keep outdoor fires small with a safety area surrounding the firepit
- 7. When considering to tackle a small fire yourself always remember the "golden rule" of fire safety. "If in doubt, get out, stay out, call the Fire Department immediately."

**THINKING OF BUILDING OR RENOVATING?** Check your details before you start. Complete a Development Permit before starting any project. Every building to be constructed or renovated needs a Development Permit. The 2020 Building Code is now in effect. Glen Harbour's Zoning By-Law and amendments are now in effect.

**NEW SPEED SIGNAGE and SPEED BUMPS:** Be aware of the new speed sign at the corner of Bluebird and Canary. This sign was made available through an SGI Grant for road safety. This signage is for the safety of all residents whether driving or walking. You will also notice that the speed bumps have not been installed. Now with the new speed sign, this is a trial as to whether we need them or not. If it is necessary they will be installed again.

FIBRE OPTIC CABLE COMING: Flexnetworks will be installing underground Fibre Optic Cable in Glen Harbour. There should be very little disruption and inconvenience to residents, but it will bring faster internet to those who sign up for it. More information is available at the village office.

**CONSENT TO USE E-MAIL FOR MUNICPAL NOTICES:** In an effort to reduce postage and printing costs, the Village is offering residents the opportunity to receive specific municipal notices (eg: tax notice) as attachments in an e-mail rather than by regular mail.
